I am writing to invite your organization to participate in consultations on amendments to the appeals procedure found in *The Foreign Worker Recruitment and Immigration Services Act*.

As you may be aware, the administration of *The Foreign Worker Recruitment and Immigration Services Act* was transferred from the Ministry of the Economy to the Ministry of Labour Relations and Workplace Safety. Initially, the two Ministries co-administered the legislation with the Ministry of Labour Relations and Workplace Safety responsible for enforcement.

Part VIII of the Act establishes that, prior to a decision being made, a director is to provide the affected party with a notice respecting the intended action and give him or her the right to make written representation. The director can hold an oral hearing if deemed appropriate, but it is not a requirement. It is the director's prerogative to conduct the hearing him/herself or to request an adjudicator hearing the matter.

Should we consider a distinct appeal process to an independent third party where the decision of the director can be challenged?
